AN ARTICLE OF INTEREST ABOUT THE MOON What is a super blue blood moon?

All the above happen at the end of this month.

Best locality to see it, Perth soon after 6:00 pm Perth time on January 31st.

[&]quot;Supermoon" – When a new moon or full moon is at perigee, the point of its orbit which is closest to Earth. Occurs approximately once every 2.5 months.

[&]quot;Blood moon" - A total lunar eclipse. The Earth's atmosphere casts a coppery hue across the moon's surface. Occurs approximately once every 1.5 years.

[&]quot;Blue moon" – Generally defined as the second full moon in a calendar month. The moon does not turn blue. Occurs approximately once every 2.5 years.

[&]quot;Super blue blood moon" - An alignment of all three lunar events. It last happened in 1866 and will happen again in 2028.
