A micromineral session will be held on Monday, October 5

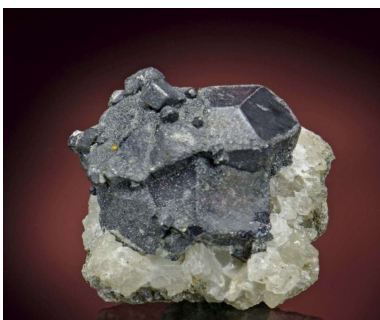
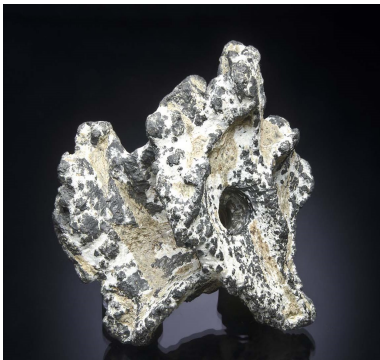
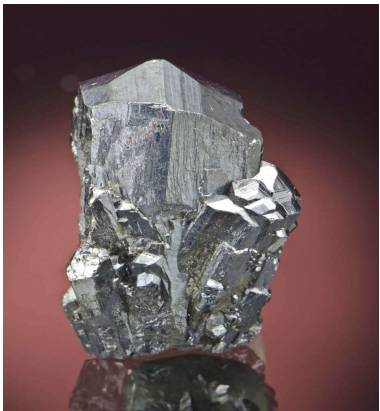
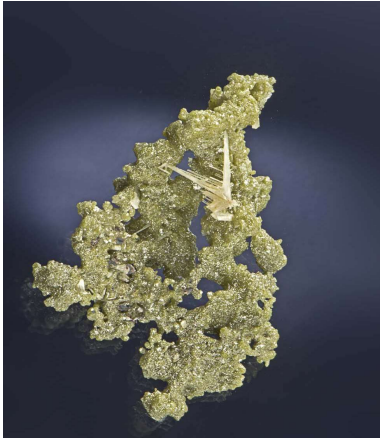
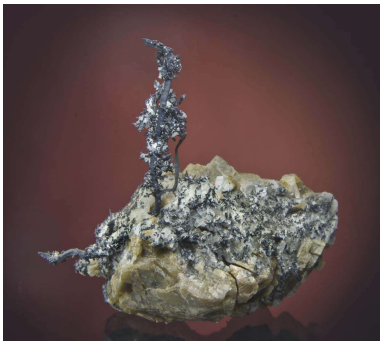
We are calling for presentations on:
