WITH REGRET

With regret it was learned that Ted Storm, Society member in Inverell, had passed away early in June. Ted had lived in Inverell for many years and had been a member of the local Lapidary club and was active in gem and minerals shows held in the New England area.

THE JUNE MEETING

Due to some members being away from Sydney on the central NSW Field Trip over the last week in June only a short report on the June Society meeting can be provided here.

As the Meeting commenced the President, Dieter Mylius, referred to lottery tickets which had been issued to each member as they had arrived, a winning ticket to be drawn later. The speaker for the evening, Jamey Wilson, had brought in a number of pieces of a very rare Russian mineral, **charoite**, to illustrate his lecture and he had donated one specimen to be provided as a door prize to the winner of the lottery.

(Charoite is a rare silicate mineral first described in 1978 and named after the Chara River in Siberia. It has only been found in massive form but is a bright intense translucent purple colour with a pearly lustre and swirling fibrous appearance. Pieces of the best examples are said to command very high prices).

The President next commended **Marian Ong** who had again brought in a several platters of extra snack foods and cup-cakes for the meeting's refreshments. He also drew attention to a box of miscellaneous minerals he had brought in to distribute as '**dollar box**' specimens, members wishing to take any were to pay a dollar per specimen to the collection box.

Ed Zbik addressed the Meeting first to announce that several more members had completed their **SWMS** applications and been awarded certificates which he handed out to those members who were present at the Meeting. The members included Martin Rosser's wife, Joanne, Denis O'brien and George Laking

Referring to the forthcoming **Field Trip** to central NSW, taking in a visit to the **Manuka mine**. Ed Zbik reported that there were now eighteen people who had registered for the trip which was scheduled to last from the 22nd to the 28th of June. Several mine sites in addition to Manuka were to be visited but final arrangements were continuing.

Geoff Parsons who had recently returned from a visit to **South America**, mainly **Colombia**, addressed the Meeting to describe some of his experiences there, notably the problems, or features, of transporting minerals through various national borders and dealing with their customs authorities. Some of these turned out to be not unfamiliar to other members including the speaker for the evening, Jamey Wilson, who was to speak about his experiences in collecting in Russia and then also bringing specimens out of that country.

Simon Tanner was then asked to deliver a talk on his visit with other Society members to the **Manuka mine** last year when members were able to collect an impressive amount of the quartz crystals for which the site has become notable. The quartz from Manuka features many large doubly-terminated specimens, all smoky to a degree, many large, fairly to quite clear and some showing internal gas-in-liquid bubbles. The speaker had taken a number of 'still' photographs of the site but also segments of video showing him approaching clay faces of the dumps with crystals conveniently exposed. These were jutting out of the surface and he was able to pull them out by hand after perhaps chopping at the clay surface briefly with his geo pick.
