FIELD TRIP REPORT

DIAMOND HILL, LOWES MOUNT STATE FOREST, OBERON

17TH AND 18TH JUNE 2023

The Minsoc field trip had ten participants gather at Lowes Mount State Forest to search for Garnets, Vesuvianite, Scheelite, Epidote and Magnetite across the various skarn outcrops in the area. We were lucky to have good weather for both days. The enthusiastic participants were Mark, Denis, Dioni, Luis, Geoff, Marion, Haley, and a big welcome to new members Scott, Cecille and Bethany.

On the Saturday there were four areas explored:

- The garnet skarn across the creek opposite the car park.
- The Scheelite and garnet skarn on the hill opposite the old drill platform.
- The Scheelite and garnet pits further up the hill. Haley drove the indomitable Jeep up to the site along the old fire-trail to the top of the hill.
- The Vesuvianite skarn in the pine forest in the afternoon. The Southern Skarn was better than the Northern one.

The search was successful with good mineral specimens of:

- Garnets
- Epidote
- Scheelite from the pits
- Calcite
- Magnetite Dioni's triple peaked specimen is a fantastic find.
- Actinolite
- Vesuvianite
- A few tantalising specks of Amethyst.
- And some possible tremolite / wollastonite (under analysis).

On Saturday, Scheelite crystals were found across the various garnet skarns as well as bright green Epidote crystals mixed with calcite, quartz, garnet, and Magnetite. Dioni found an excellent specimen of Magnetite that was the largest found on the day.

On Saturday night Geoff, Denis, Mark, Dioni, and Luis had dinner at the Oberon RSL Club and enjoyed an excellent evening. Geoff was lucky and won a pair of Toohey's socks in a competition.

On Sunday morning Denis went alone to the Vesuvianite site and found nice yellow Vesuvianite crystals in the loose rocks lying under the grass around the boulders. By lunch time the weather had closed in and it was time to finish for the day.

Mark, Dioni, Luis, Geoff, Scott, and Bethany checked out the Smokey Quartz pits and the amethyst area on Diamond Vale Road but did not find any significant specimens except a few points. Best pieces were in the spoil of previous diggings. We found one small quartz crystal with abundant trapped solid inclusion. We cleaned out some of the pits but nothing was left to find. The road was challenging with large ruts and trenches, Luis had to leave his little car behind.

All the sites explored at Diamond Hill over the weekend provided specimens of value and are worthy of further investigation. It was particularly exciting to find the Vesuvianite site again as Minsoc has not collected from here since 2017.

Thank you to all participants for attending the field trip and to Mark who has done so much work to arrange an entertaining weekend.







Report by Denis O'Brien

The JUNE MEETING

The June Meeting was opened by the President, Dieter Mylius, who welcomed members and two visitors who were attending in virtual mode. The virtual connection was still giving some trouble and hopefully more experience would improve the facility. There were a few announcements.

Mark Walters reported that the projected **Field Trip to Lowes Mt** near Oberon was going ahead as scheduled over the weekend of the 17th and 18th of the month and at the moment he had ten applicants to attend and could take two more. Any further members wishing to attend should have their SWMS certificates up-to-date, have applied for a fossicking permit for State Forests and also be financial.

Graham Ogle announced that the next **Micro-mineral Group Meeting** would be on Sunday the 11th of June at John Chapman's house in Ryde and on the theme of 'Self-Collected Minerals'.

The President drew attention to information in the Society June Newsletter about the forthcoming **45th Annual Seminar of the Joint Mineralogical Societies of Australasia** being held in November at the Grindelwald Conference Centre, in Northern Tasmania, near Launceston.

The first lecture of the evening was given by Graham Ogle and described a visit he made a few weeks earlier this year to Cornwall particularly the **Levant Mine and the Royal Cornwall Museum**. There has been quite a history to Cornish mining because many miners gaining experience in Cornwall then immigrated to other mining areas around the World including South Africa and Australia. The Museum was threatened with being closed due to lack of funding but a grant had come through recently.

The second lecture was provided by Luis Martins on 'Pegmatites: What are they and why do we like them?

Both lectures were extensively illustrated with a series of images. Summaries of the lectures with illustrations will be provided in a subsequent Newsletter.
