Report on the Visit to the Tallawang Magnetite Mine

A large open-cut pit 36m x 183m x 60m deep with four levels below the base of the open cut extending south. The Tallawang magnetite deposit provides a source of high-grade magnetite for coal beneficiation and represents a rare example of an economic Fe-skarn developed in the Palaeozoic Lachlan Fold Belt of eastern Australia. Magnetite is one of the first minerals to crystallise out of magma.


History:

Tallawang Iron Ore Quarry. Between 1902 and 1927 over half a million tonnes of magnetite and haematite iron ore was quarried at Tallawang, north of Gulgong for the Hoskins Steelworks at Lithgow.

Mineral Geo Profile.

The Tallawang skarn deposits have a complex geological history with the skarn being related to earlier, more mafic, intrusions. The Tallawang magnetite deposit consists of two major zones of magnetite that formed in the *Silurian Dungeree Volcanics* (418Ma), adjacent to the western boundary of the deformed Tallawang Granite, a sill-like microgranite of probable Early Permian age.

The skarns have a complex history: an early metasomatic event overprinted by at least two stages of deformation. The second deformation is interpreted to be part of the Kanimblan Orogeny. Initially, a magnetite-garnet (grossularite-andradite)-hedenbergite skarn assemblage formed at a temperature of ~600° to 650°C.




The magnetite skarns were then brecciated prior to a hydrous stage involving the deposition of additional magnetite, with chlorite-rich hastingsite, hastingsite-hornblende, allanite, epidote, quartz, apatite and pyrite. The mineralisation was then overprinted by lower amphibolite facies regional metamorphism. This metamorphic event has been dated at 360Ma. Peak metamorphic conditions occurred at the range 530° to 590°C, according to garnet-biotite geothermometry (slightly higher temperatures are obtained from the garnet-cordierite geothermometer. Finally, a retrograde chlorite-epidote-calcite-quartz-actinolite assemblage formed at around 350° to 365°C, under greenschist facies conditions. Following this, minor post-tectonic pyrite veining and late brittle deformation, caused by the emplacement of the late Early Carboniferous Gulgong Granite, represents the final mineralising event. Pyrite at Tallawang is intimately intergrown with Skarn magnetite, although textural studies indicate that pyrite invariably developed later in the paragenesis than the bulk of the magnetite.

Debate continues whether Tallawang was likely to have been extracted from mafic and felsic metavolcanics and metasediments of the Silurian Dungeree Volcanics in a magmatic / meteoric convection system rather than from the nearby Tallawang Granite. The Early Devonian Tallawang Granite was the heat source for skarn formation.¹
