THE MAY MEETING

The May meeting program entirely comprised the annual Society Auction but initially there were a few announcements and reports presented.

Graham Ogle reported that the next meeting of the **Micro-Mineral Group** would be held in the Parramatta and Holroyd Lapidary Club rooms a week on the following Saturday the 11th from 1.00pm.

Ed Zbik announced that five more members had completed **Society SWMS certificates**. The members were Brian Holden, Robyn Baker, Glenn Brown, Ken Mitchell and Steve Petkovski.

Ed then reported on his progress organising the projected **Field Trip to Manuka and central NSW** to be held over the last week of June. Final arrangements including the dates for the trip which were projected to be between the 20th to 30th of June were still to be confirmed. Apart from 2-3 days to be spent at the Manuka mine Ed was still negotiating and making arrangements to visit a number of other sites in central NSW over the period. Members who had registered for the trip would be kept informed about the developments.

Before the Auction commenced Dieter Mylius thanked **Jim Sharpe** for his organising the Auction again this year and also **Marian Ong** who had brought in several platters of hot snack foods which she had cooked and prepared herself for the members. Marian's contribution added considerably to the amount of refreshments which had been brought in but by the end of the evening nearly all of the food had been consumed.

The Auction was conducted this year by **Glenn Brown** who proceeded competently, briskly and cheerfully to dispose of the seventy-six lots which had been brought in for sale. He was assisted by Dieter Mylius displaying each specimen as it came up. There was a ten-minute break about half-way through the auction and by the end of the sale the lots had been sold for a total of about \$3,500. After the auction had finished members were recommended to take an additional ten minutes to examine and make bids for the silent auction specimens and trays which had been brought in. There were quite a number of these and it was possible that by the end of the evening total sales of all specimens had been in the region of \$4,000.

Thanks are also due to the members who helped clean up the Lapidary Club room at the end of the evening including washing up used plates and cutlery, cleaning tables and re-arranging all the chairs and tables back to their normal positions.
